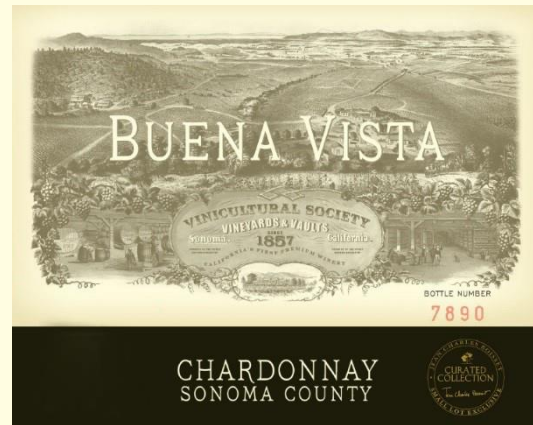
CHARDONNAY SONOMA COUNTY

The Buena Vista Vinicultural Society, formed in 1863 by the winery's founder, Count Agoston Haraszthy, to further improve its winemaking prowess and expand its vineyards, has been restored as a collection of unique, small-production wines that honor the winery's pioneering spirit and contribution to California winemaking.

These Curated Collections are small-lot wines chosen by Jean-Charles Boisset exclusively for the Boisset Ambassador program. Available for a limited time, each wine is crafted by our winemakers to deliver the highest quality for the price. This limited-edition wine has been hand-selected by Jean-Charles Boisset to capture the style and excellence of the Boisset Collection's portfolio of premium wineries.

The grapes for this 2019 Chardonnay come from Sonoma County, where warm days and cool nights allow for rich flavor development and maturation. The grapes were hand harvested in the earlier morning hours between September 9 and October 1 to retain freshness and were aged for 10 months in 15% new French oak before being bottled.

Bright aromas of green apple and Asian pear spring from the glass with a hint of toasted almond. Citrus notes are complemented by mango and peach flavors with a swirl of caramel and brioche. This is a well-structured and delightful Chardonnay with a subtle creaminess on the finish. These very special wines are produced in quantities of 500 or fewer cases and are exclusively offered through our Boisset Collection Ambassadors.
